Minutes of the 46th Annual General Meeting held at Penrith Golf Club On Saturday 19th October 2024

5. Honorary Competition Secretary Report

Lady Captains, Presidents, county Lady captain and President, lady captains ladies, I am sorry I cannot be with you all to read my report but I hope to see you all at least at one of our competitions in 2025. 2024 started as usual with our Silver and Bronze Championships this year at Penrith Golf club. The relentless rain over the winter and early spring meant it was very difficult for the Penrith green staff to prepare the course for us to the standard they would have liked. However in the end it was only the greens that made us decide to make it a non-qualifying round on the Monday, which the players appreciated, many of whom had hardly played because of so many closures at most of the courses because of the weather. 95 ladies played on the Monday in the two championships and saw Marian McFeagan, Keswick GC, with the best gross stableford score and Diane Law, Kirkby Lonsdale GC, the Bronze Champion with best converted gross. The best silver nett score was by Carole Slinger, Penrith GC and Brenda Ewbank, Appleby GC, had the best gross score. Brenda went on into the knockout stages and became the Silver champion. The knockout stages were played on the Tuesday and Wednesday when the playing conditions became gradually better. The winner of the Cupboard trophy which is played by the second flight was won by Anne Cousin, Appleby GC.

The sun is shining, no clouds in the sky, just a light breeze coming off the sea and the ladies in short shirt sleeves. Is this the Costa del Sol? No think again it is the Costa del Walney in June. This is the Team of three at Furness Golf Club where the 29 teams were treated to a lovely course in good conditions. The scores were excellent especially by the local team of Alyson Wood, Anne Edwards and Jane Trelore the eventual winners. The team make up was to have a maximum total of the three Handicap Indices as 120. This meant that we could include ladies of all handicaps up to 54. This new restriction was well received by those who gave their feedback. After the presentation, the day was extra special as we had a celebration for Jan Moore's birthday, who was 90 on the day and had insisted she was going to play in the competition. She has been Captain and President of both the CVLGA and also the Northern Counties Ladies Golf Association and always supported both associations.

We also had positive feedback of the change we made to the rules for the 4BBB winners held at Keswick GC. The 28 pairs were put into three handicap divisions with prizes for the winners of each division. The winners of the trophy were the local pair of Judy Figg and Vera Jackson, who had the overall best score from the three divisions. Again, the poor weather which continued to hamper the green staff preparing the course had made underfoot conditions difficult. Even so there were some good scores and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves.

Unfortunately, we did not have enough entries for the Mixed 4BBB at Eden GC to take place, but hope that next year ladies you will find a willing gent to join you at Penrith GC.

We would like to thank all three clubs for their great hospitality and help they gave us to run our competitions. Plus of course the green staff who under such difficult weather conditions worked tirelessly to

prepare the courses to the best possible. Also a special thanks from me to the support from the committee. We look forward to 2025, which for me will be my last year as Competition's secretary. The CVLGA will be looking for a replacement and it would certainly be good if someone came forward early to work closely with me during the year. We will be using the software the County Ladies have used this year through the Cumbrian Union website. The link will be on our CVLGA website. The competitions, terms and conditions, and the posters will also be on our website. Here's to a great 2025 with sunny skies and no rain. Well I like to dream!

6. Honorary Treasurer's Report

This year we made a surplus of £655.19 due very much to the amounts raised in the raffles and the support for the competitions, the championships in particular.

Our numbers have dropped by 8 this year with subscriptions down £48 on last year. Maryport leaving us altogether was very sad after so many years.

Competitions have run well thanks to Rose and Joan and all the club helpers, sadly the mixed 4BBB had to be cancelled as so few members had entered.

The Richardson Trophy matches went well as ever. The bronze ladies had a great time playing in their matches against Durham and Northumberland and this year they have been able to purchase pink polo shirts to replace the white ones worn in the past.

It is many years since we raised our subscription and so that we can continue the subscription will be raised from £6 to £7 for 2025. We are in the process of updating our entries to competitions and due to this we need to purchase a laptop and a subscription to allow on line entry.

We are always looking for new members so please encourage your club members to join the vets and participate in our Championships and competitions. We need you and we always have fun!

The County Championships for both Silver and Bronze ran concurrently here at Penrith which I think was a successful re-instatement of the format, but they were a cause of huge personal anxiety, before even a ball had been teed up, all due to the unprecedented weather, which has unfortunately been a feature of the season. You cannot change the weather, you can only manage it – these situations happen, it's how you deal with it that matters, a little bit like when your ball intended for the fairway goes into the thick rough. So, it was such a huge relief and pleasure to see so many competitors on the course and in the clubhouse. Congratulations to everyone who entered and who dealt with the conditions. Congratulations to all the qualifiers and prize winners, especially to our Silver Champion Brenda Ewbank and to the Bronze Champion Diane Law.

I must express my sincere thanks to Penrith GC for the fantastic support they have given the Vets this year,

by not only allowing us to hold the Championships but also reacting positively when we played practice, Bronze and Richardson Trophy matches. Such unstinting support is very much appreciated. It personally makes me feel proud to be a member of a hospitable and welcoming club.

All match reports for the Bronze Team and Richardson Trophy matches are on the website, for which I must thank Sue Cotter. As such, I don't intend to detail them in this report, other than to say I was once again bowled over by the team spirit, camaraderie and pride that blossoms when players don the pink shirts and navy tops with the Cumbria badge emblazoned across the front. Representing your County is special, it's all about team work, making connections, honesty and caring for each other. Suffice to say, we had some very good results, winning 2 of our Richardson Trophy matches and finishing a respectable joint 3rd overall on match points. County colours were awarded to Fliss Holloway, well done Fliss. The Bronze team were victorious in their match against Northumberland and came a good second to Durham in a very close match.

I am delighted to announce that Jo Tinsley, Appleby and Helen Halsall, Kendal will soon be taking on the administration of the Northern Association on behalf of Cumbria as Secretary and Treasurer respectively. Sincere thanks and appreciation go to Jo and Helen for taking on these roles, as it ensures Cumbria, which may be small, is nonetheless a proactive member at the northern regional level.
